Kathleen Dorgan, AIA, LEED-AP, Principal of Dorgan Architecture & Planning, is a practitioner of comprehensive sustainable community development. Her projects are featured in *Good Neighbors: Affordable Family Housing*, *The Design Advisor*, *Design Matters* and the National Building Museum's exhibit *Affordable Housing: Designing an American Asset*.
